**A NEW SKILLS COURSE**

A new course will soon be taught at the PKH Centre. The Maintenance Technicians Course, starting in March 2010, will equip up to 24 young men with the technical skills required for building services and technical maintenance. These include basic carpentry, plumbing, welding, electrical and painting works, and the installation and maintenance of air-conditioners.

This Course will give youths the advantage to be employable in an economy that has seen more commercial and hotel buildings being constructed in recent years.



**A NEW DORMITORY BLOCK**

A single-storey building comprising 3 dormitory halls to house 60 people will be constructed by early 2010. The provision of this new dormitory block will free up PKH's existing facilities for the new Maintenance Course Workshop and enable all PKH students to be housed within the premises of the PKH Centre.

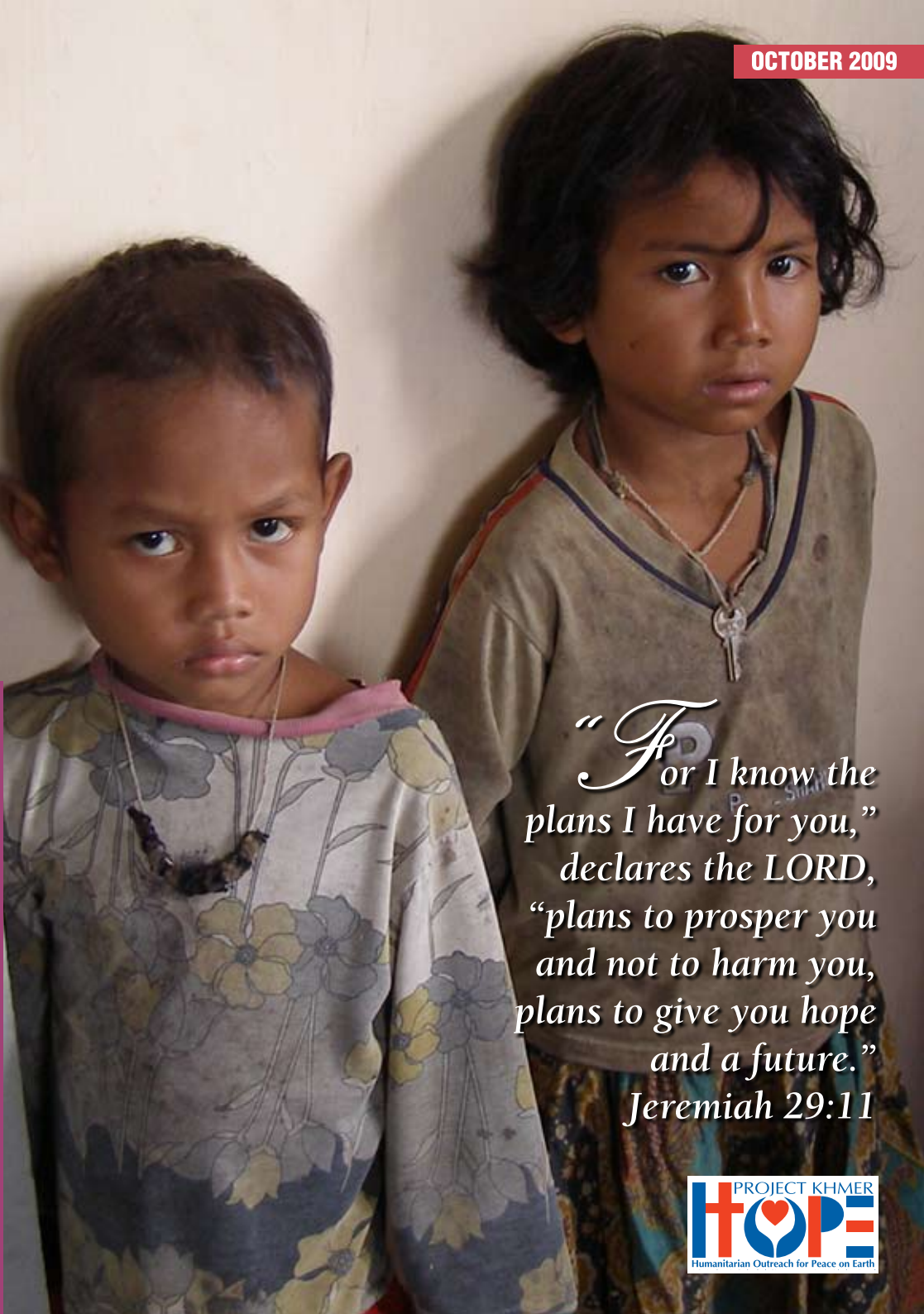

**Project Khmer H.O.P.E. (Humanitarian Outreach for Peace on Earth)** was set up by St. Andrew's Cathedral, Singapore in 2000 to share God's love with poor and needy Cambodians by meeting their economic and social needs. It operates from the PKH (Anglican) Centre located in the Chbarmon district of Kampong Speu Province in Cambodia.

PKH was registered as an international non-governmental organization (NGO) in Cambodia in January 2002 and it works in collaboration with the Ministry of Social Affairs, Veterans and Youth Rehabilitation.



## PKH SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

... a chance to break out of the poverty cycle.



**PKH** works at transforming the lives of 120 poor and needy youths each year through its vocational skills training programme. Many of these young men and women, between the ages of 17 and 23 years, drop out of school because of poverty. They usually live at subsistence levels by working in the fields; there are a few who have been driven to delinquency.

Tourism has been on the increase in Cambodia and PKH has chosen to give such youths a hope and a future by equipping them with skills to work in the hotel/tourism industry. They are provided with free hostel lodging, food and vocational training at the PKH Centre. The 2-year programme comprises an intensive course in the first year to enable the youths to write and speak English, as well as to use the computer. This is followed, in the second year, by a comprehensive course in either Hospital-



ity Services or Housekeeping and a 3-month industry attachment in the hotels. The training is conducted by a team of expatriate and local trainers.

In the last 4 years, more than 90% of these youths have gained employment in the tourist hubs of Siem Reap, Sihanoukville and Phnom Penh. They work in the Food and Beverage, Front Office and Housekeeping Departments of the hotels and their starting salaries range between US\$60 and US\$90. With these jobs, they are able to support themselves and also provide for their families in the provinces. These young people have had a chance to break out of the poverty cycle.

## PKH's scope of works includes ...



### Childcare for Orphans, Street-kids and Poor Village Children

Seeds of Hope Childcare is PKH's joint effort with another NGO, Full Gospel Assembly Cambodia (FGAC) to care for 120 poor and needy children (6 – 18 years old). PKH annually supports 40 of these children since 2001. These children are provided with a Christian home at the adjoining FGAC Centre/Orphanage and education in public schools. Over the years, many of these children have grown up well, with a significant number of them receiving tertiary education in the universities in Phnom Penh and others gainfully employed. These children have had the opportunity to lead meaningful lives.

### Healthcare for the Poor

PKH works to reduce Cambodia's rate of child mortality as well as to combat Malaria and malnutrition in the very rural areas of the Kampong Speu Province. In 2008, the PKH doctor and the healthcare team treated an average of 370 villagers a month. This was done by providing free mobile clinic services weekly at 3 health-posts (Char En, Tropeng Chou and Rolak Kong Choeun) in Aoral. This is a very remote district in the Province without a functional medical clinic/centre. Most of the people in Aoral are very poor; barter for the basic necessities of life is still practised in a few of the villages. Healthcare practices, including pre and post natal care, are often primitive. The healthcare team also attends to the medical needs of the 250 children, youth and staff at the PKH Centre.

### Pastoral Guidance for Youths

The Living Streams Youth Club organizes recreational activities and offers Christian pastoral guidance during the weekends. The Club aims at improving the social fabric of the community by building the lives and character of the youths. There are youths who have come to faith in Jesus Christ; they have had their lives transformed by the power of God's love.

### Aid to the Community

Welfare aid in the form of rations of rice, oil, blankets, soap, mosquito nets, clothing and medicines are often distributed to poor villagers suffering the effects of the drought or floods.
